

Mitchellville City Council Proceedings  
Regular Meeting – February 16, 2015

The Mitchellville City Council met in regular session at 7:02 pm in the council chambers of City Hall, 204 Center Ave. N., pursuant to notice.

Mayor Filbert called the meeting to order, roll call, members present: McGhee, Crook, Thomas, Zook and Engler.

A motion by Crook to approved the tentative agenda, second by Thomas. Motion carried unanimous.

A motion by Crook to approve the consent agenda approving partial payment of \$64,006.44 to Visu-Sewer, Inc. on the Sewer Rehab Project, paying claims of \$165,276.90 includes 1 regular payroll, and the 2-2-15 council minutes. The Library Board of Trustees 12-29-14 meeting minutes and Jan. 2015 bills, second by Thomas. Motion carried unanimous.


Public Audience: None

Pastor Hill was running late so the Council went on to updates on the opening on City boards and commissions. Engler stated she had contact several people about the openings and has some interest. Zook felt the City needs more women on the boards. He said he would talk to parents about the Park and Recreation board after the weather warmed up and Little League got started. He stated the council need to be careful and not put just anyone on the boards. Thomas stated she had talked to several people and did not have anyone interested. Norton notified the council that we had received a request to be on P&Z or BOA and she had turned it into the Mayor. There was some discussion on members who are currently sitting on boards that are not participating and what should be done. The council will continue working on this issue.

Pastor Martha Hill of the Mitchellville United Methodist Church shared with council that the Methodist Church has been working with Free Clinics of Iowa on getting a free mobile medical clinic started in Mitchellville. She stated they had a physician volunteer to come to Mitchellville one Tuesday a month and use of a mobile clinic from Des Moines University. There will be a church committee overseeing the operation. The main focus is on access not income. Their hope is to have the clinic here more than once a month. She also was looking to the council for suggestions for Habitat for Humanity. This year they were thinking they might do a community project instead of an individual. The church is offering free archery classes.

Updates were given by the Mayor and council members. No department heads were present at the meeting.

Mayor Filbert adjourned the meeting at 7:43 pm.
