

Mitchellville City Council Proceedings
Regular Meeting – September 15, 2014

The Mitchellville City Council met in regular session at 7:00 pm in the council chambers of City Hall, 204 Center Ave. N., pursuant to notice.

Mayor Filbert called the meeting to order, roll call, members present: Mc Ghee, Crook, Thomas, Zook and Engler.

A motion by Crook to approve the tentative agenda, second by Thomas. Motion carried unanimous

A motion by McGhee to approve the consent agenda paying claims of \$88,279.40 includes 1 regular payroll and the 9-2-14 council minutes, second by Zook. Motion carried unanimous.

Public Audience: Sheri Roberts, 106 6th St. NW, updated on the success of the TMD celebration and thanked each of city departments for their help and support.

Dan Oldenburg, 114 2nd St. NW has some questions about some of the city ordinances and it was suggested he request to be on the agenda allowing him more than 3 minutes and more interactions with the council.

A motion by Crook to approve Resolution 2014-45 adopting the Polk County Multi-Jurisdictional Local Hazard Mitigation Plan, second by Thomas. Motion carried unanimous.

A motion by McGhee to approve Resolution 2014-46 adopting a Policy on the Prohibition of the Use of Excessive Force, second by Crook. Motion carried unanimous.

A motion by Thomas to approve the adoption of a Residential Anti-Displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan as required by the CDBG regulations, second by Engler. Motion carried unanimous.

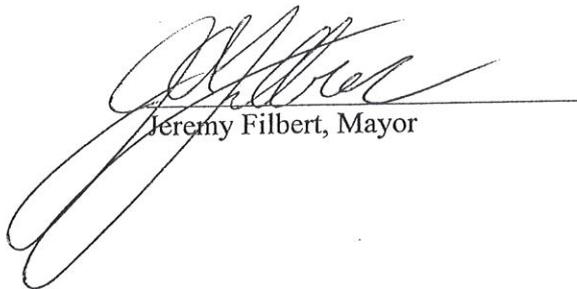
There was some discussion by the council on the multiple steps that are required for voluntary annexation of the land north west of the city. Council member McGhee noted he would contact Lansink Construction requesting a site plan as well as business plan for the property and suggested a work session for the October 6th meeting.

A motion by Crook to donate the administration office old desks to the Goodwill drive on October 3rd, second by Thomas. Motion carried unanimous.

Updates from department heads, council members and mayor. McGhee stated that an issue at the September 5th meeting was looked into and all the city departments followed proper protocols. Clerk Norton stated a company was looking at relocating from Des Moines to 205 6th St. NW.

Public Audience: Mike Ryan, 9959 NE 62nd Ave, asked if the company looking to relocate would be bringing new jobs to town and was told no, it was an established business.

Mayor Filbert adjourned the meeting at 8:13 pm.
